Sharing, the Joy of Abundance.

A few weeks ago, I went hiking. Living in the beautiful state of Colorado, it's hard not to enjoy hiking with beautiful nature. Originally, I had planned to go to the Bear Lake trail in Rocky Mountain National Park, but I forgot to make a Timed Entry reservation, so I ended up going somewhere else. I went to the Mount Sanitas train in Boulder and hiked for about three hours. It was a rather tough hike, but the view from the summit, surrounded by mountains and the blue sky, refreshed me so much.

When I reached the summit, there were a few people there. Even though we didn't know each other, we exchanged simple greetings and sat together, admiring the scenic view. Since I had planned to go to Rocky Mountain National Park, I had brought plenty of water and snacks – too much, actually. I shared drinks and snacks with the people around. One person was thankful because he had run out of water, and another was happy, saying she had been craving salty potato chips. Then, they also took out the snacks they had brought and shared them. Tangerines, cucumbers, apple, etc. And someone gave me a cup of warm coffee, and the combination of that coffee and the beautiful view was truly fantastic. Even though we were strangers, that small act of sharing opened our hearts to one another. With those hearts, we gave each other fist bumps and parted ways.

Sharing gives us joy and meaning beyond what we receive. In the moment we help someone, we share in their joy, and through that, we experience even greater joy ourselves. Through the process of sharing, we come to realize how abundant we are, and the joy we receive from sharing deepens and broadens our lives. Whether we share something big or small, the size doesn't matter. What matters is our heart and attitude. A small act of kindness can be a light in someone's life, and a short moment can be a comfort to someone. Willingly offering what we have is not only a sacrifice for the other person but also a gift to ourselves. Through sharing, our hearts become broader, and our souls lighter and freer. Another amazing thing about sharing is that it has a ripple effect. A small act of kindness or consideration can inspire someone else, and that person may go on to share with another, creating a virtuous cycle. This cycle of sharing can affect far more people than we realize, and through it, we witness how God's love expands, Sharing connects us, and through that connection, we form an even larger community.

Starting in October, we will walk together through a seven-week stewardship journey. During this time, I hope it will be a period of reflection and commitment as we think about how, as God's stewards, we can live generous lives of sharing. For the church we love, for our brothers and sisters whom we cherish and serve, and for the community we serve. May this journey be an opportunity to expand the scope of God's grace.


